



**Polytechnic of Namibia
Graduation Report
April 2011**

Introduction

This document presents statistics of the 2010 Graduates for the April 2011 Graduation Ceremony as part of the graduation information. A total of 1452 awards were offered to 1317 graduates who met the minimum graduation requirements. The graduates were conferred degrees, diplomas or certificates. The awards are categorised in terms of Award types, Schools and Departments. Comparisons between Schools, Departments and Gender are also presented.

The data was collected from the faculty officers and forwarded to the MIIR office via emails. The information was analysed and presented in charts and tables.

The document comprises six sections. Section 1 presents the graduates per Qualification Type awarded and Qualification type registered. Section 2 presents awards by Offering Type. Section 3 shows awards offered per School. Section 4 and 5 illustrate Awards per School, Qualification Type awarded and Awards per School, Qualifications Registered and Qualification Types awarded respectively. Finally, Section 6 presents Nationality, Age and Marital Status of the graduates.

1. Graduates per Qualification Type Awarded and Qualification Type Registered

This section presents the graduates per qualification type awarded and qualification type registered (Table 1.1). A comparison between gender of the graduates is also shown per qualification registered (Table 1.2).

Table 1.1 above shows the number and the percentages of awards given to graduates per qualification type awarded by gender. The highest award types were Diplomas 36.4%, followed sequentially by Certificate 32.3%; Bachelors 24.9%; and Bachelor (Honours) degrees 1.3%. More than half of the graduates were female (56.3%).

Table 1.2 above indicates that a total of 1452 awards, the highest number of awards were Bachelor (1268), Bachelor (Honours) (39), Diploma (112), Higher Certificates (5), and Certificates (28) in that order.

2. Awards by Offering Type

This section presents the awards per offering type and gender (Table 2.1). A distinction is drawn between the offering type and qualification type (Table 2.2).

Table 2.1: Awards per Offering Type and Gender

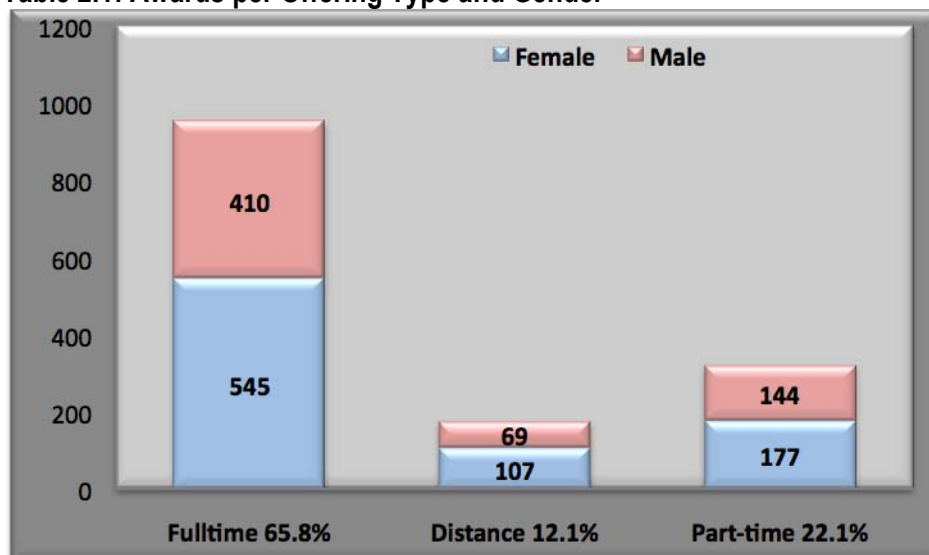


Table 2.1 shows that the majority of the awards (65.8%) were offered to fulltime students, 12.1% awards to part-time and 22.1% to distance students. Women graduates (57%) were more than the male graduates (43%).

Table 2.2 shows the awards per offering type and qualification type awarded per gender. Out of the 1452 awards, more awards were offered to female graduates. For both full-time and part-time offering types, on average, female graduates outnumbered the male graduates in all qualification types awarded.

3. Awards per School

This section presents the awards offered per school (Table 3.1) and qualification type awarded per gender (Table 3.2).

Table 3.1 shows awards offered per school and gender. The School of Business and Management offered the highest number of award (65.7%) followed sequentially by the School of Engineering (10.3%), School of Natural Resources and Tourism (11.6%), School of Information Technology (7.7%), and School of Communication (4.3%).

Table 4.3 shows that the majority of the awards in the School of Engineering were National Diplomas. Most of the awards were in the Department of Civil Engineering (41) followed by the Department of Vocational Education and Training (35); Electronic Engineering (30), Department of Electrical Engineering (28) and the Department of Mechanical Engineering (15). More than two-thirds of the awards were offered to male graduates.

Table 4.5 shows that in the Faculty of Natural Resources & Tourism a total of 169 awards were offered in the different departments as follows: Hospitality and Tourism Management (60), Land Management (54), Agriculture (27), Nature Conservation (28). More than half of the awards (57%) went to female candidates.

Table 5.6 shows that the highest number of awards were offered in the B.Tech Travel and Tourism with female (54%) receiving slightly more awards than the male candidates.

6. Duration of Period of Study per School, Award Type and Gender

This section presents the average duration of studies in years per qualification awarded, Offering Type and school divided in gender denominations (Table 6.1-6.3). The average time to complete each qualification is calculated by using the total number of years each student is registered at the Polytechnic of Namibia. The student may have been registered for and/or completed another award during this time.

Table 6.1 shows that the duration of period of studies per qualification type varies considerably. The duration varies on average in a descending order of bachelors degree (5.0 years), Diploma (4.2 years), Higher Certificate (4.9 years), Bachelor Honours (4.1 years) and Certificate (2.9 years).

Table 6.2 shows that the graduates take on average 4 years to complete a qualification type. However, the maximum average duration of 4.7 years in the School of Engineering and 4.0 years under the School of Information Technology was recorded for females to obtain Bachelor's degrees.

7. Nationality and Age

This section presents the nationality, age and marital status of the graduates.

Figure 7.1: SADC Countries Graduates

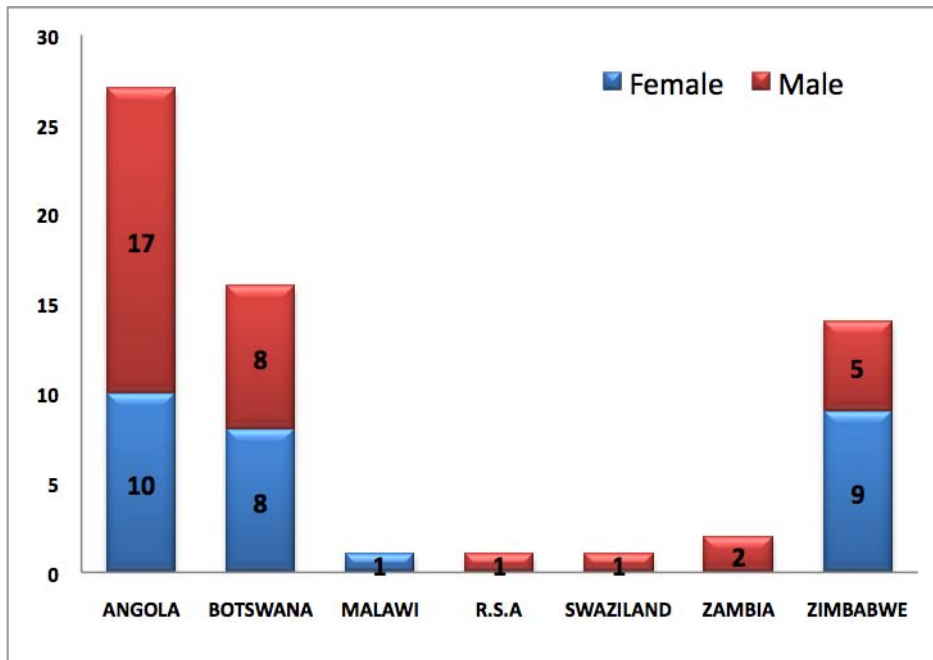


Figure 7.1 shows that the highest number of graduates are from Angola (27) followed by Botswana (16) and Zimbabwe (14).

Table 7.3 shows that about slightly more than half of the graduates were between the age categories of 21-25 years (51%), followed by 26-30 years (21%) of age and descending with the oldest graduates who were above 46 years of age.
